Christ	ian martyrdom is not a thing of the past. Some recent statistics back up that statement:
	• Well over Christians (a conservative number) are martyred worldwide each year.
	• The U.S. State Department reports that Christians in more than countries are persecuted by their government or by their neighbors.
	• In North Korea, Christianity is illegal, and about Christians are now held in labor camps.
	• In Nigeria, almost churches were destroyed and Christians were killed in 2013.
	• The government of monitors Christian church services and arrests new converts.
	• Eight states in have passed anti-conversion laws, which are used to disrupt church services, force Christians from their homes, destroy church buildings, and even kill pastors.
